Materials

- Make your own Pegsies[™] blank wooden character
- Make your own Pegsies[™] drawing sheet
 - o Additional drawing sheets can be downloaded for free on Pegsies.com
- Pencil (for drawing your ideas)
- Colors (we've had good results with the below materials on the wooden character)
 - Markers
 - Water Colors
 - Acrylic Paints
 - Crayons
 - Pens
- Mod Podge® [optional] to help protect your character during playtime
- Hot Glue [optional] to glue on hats or other accessories

Tips and Tricks

- Draw and color many ideas before coloring on the wooden character (if you need additional drawing sheets, they can be downloaded for free on Pegsies.com).
- Details are sometimes difficult to draw on a wooden character, try to start simple.
- If you want small details, try using a pen or small brush.
- Draw your design on the wooden character with a pencil first. You can erase mistakes and then color in the lines once you are ready!
- Colors sometimes take a little bit to dry on the wooden character. Try not to smear your hard work.
- Take your time, let a coat of paint/color dry before going over it.
- Use Mod Podge® to cover your wooden character after done coloring. It will help protect it during play.
- Many different materials can be used in addition to colors. Maybe use yarn for hair. Or try felt for clothing or other accessories. Hot glue is a great way to have your materials stick to your character.
- Make sure you clean up your workspace when done. Don't let your paints or markers dry out so you
 have them for your next design!
